Quota modification proposals (one from Finland, one from Russia)

The current quota system does not work properly if EMA does not receive sufficient number of seats to assign seats to member associations based on the A1 and A2 Part of the quota. Two different options to deal with this issue were presented to the GA - they are attached to this document.

A vote was held between

- The Russian proposal (1 vote)
- The Finnish proposal (17 votes)
- Keep the System unchanged (0 votes)
- Abstentions: 8

The Finnish proposal was accepted by majority.

Proposal to change the regulations for the end of a round:

A proposal from Spain on changing how to handle round ends was discussed. The idea is to adopt a system where the current hand will not end with the gong, but play continues until its normal end. In order to give an estimation of the effect on a tournament schedule, the following statistic was presented:

Round 1

- worst table 11 hands (11:00 / hand)
- 13 or fewer hands: 3 tables (8%, 9:12 / hand)
- 14 Hands: 14 tables (22%, 8:36 / hand)
- 15 Hands: 14 tables (22%, 8.00 / hand)
- 16 Hands : 31 tables (48%, 7:30 / hand)
- average: 8:00/hand => 128 minutes / round

Round 2:

- worst table 13 hands (9:12 / hand)
- 13 hands: 2 tables (3%, 9:12 / hand)
- 14 hands: 11 tables (17%, 8:36 / hand)
- 15 hands: 18 tables (28%, 8:00 / hand)
- 16 hands: 33 tables (52%, 7:30 / hand)
- average: 7:53/hand => 126 minutes / round

Round 3:

- worst table 12 hands
- 13 hands or fewer 2 tables (3%)
- 14 hands: 8 tables (13%)
- 15hands: 19 tables (30%)
- 16 hands: 35 tables (54%)
- average: 7:50/hand => 125 minutes / round

After a lively discussion, the proposal was formalized to:

The MERS Tournament regulations are to be amended by the following items with regards to tournament format for MCR Tournaments, effective 1st of January

- When the bell rings, play continues until the current hand is finished
- The first roll of the dice after the walls are fully built is considered "start of the hand" for this purpose.
- The hand is not considered started if the gong sounds before the walls are fully built, even if the dice were rolled.
- Organizers are required to account for this in the schedule. Advice is to This may be done by shortening play time or extending break time.

This proposal was accepted, with 22 votes cast for the proposal, 2 votes cast against the proposal and 2 abstentions
