LOCATION:

The tournament took place at the **Godalming Masonic Hall**, located in the wooded valley of the River Ock on the south side of the town.

A spacious location with free parking spaces provided for the participants, and easy access from downtown and local train station which is about 10 minutes walk distance.



The main function room used as game room was spacious enough to host comfortably 48 players and leave space between tables with avoiding disturbance during games.

The reception area is accessible to participants during their breaks and social moments.







EQUIPMENT:

 $2.6 \times 1.9 \times 1.6 \text{ cm}$ regular riichi mahjong set with $65 \times 65 \text{ cm}$ riichi mahjong on folding bridge tables were used for the game sessions.

A print of the riichi Yaku overview and summery sheet was available on each table. Sanitizer hand gel was available.

REFEREEING:

Mr. Shaun Drury (GBR), Mr. Philip Bielby (GBR) and Mr. John Duckworth (GBR) were assigned as player referees.

COMPLAINTS:

No complaint has been recorded during the event.

INFORMATION / COMMUNICATION DURING THE TOURNAMENT:

Information was clear and well communicated throughout the tournament.

Information about players seat maps was given on prints during registration on Saturday morning before the first game session. The organisation team had planned a set of 48-player seat map, and an additional spare set of 44-players seating map in case of unforeseen circumstances.

Global information was given to all participants during the tournament opening meeting, which included the welcome messages to the players, the tournament schedules, the assignment of the referees and the observer for the tournament, and other rules and instructions about the event.

Additionally, as this was one of the first MERS tournaments after COVID-19 unfreeze. the organization team recommended the players to take protective measures, such as wearing face masks and use sanitizing hand gel, despite the abrogation of the previous EMA COVID-19-special-ruling.

Scoreboard was projected on TV screens in the game room and reception area, so each participant can see to the results and ranking after each game session.

SESSIONS:



A non-player assistant was appointed to manage game sessions, with the role of, in the beginning of each game session, giving the kick-off signal to clearly inform the players of the timer start, and managing the score entries.

During each game session, a visible timer clock was projected from a computer on TV screen in the game room.

Results and ranking are up to date between each session, displayed on the TV screen.

Excellent playing atmosphere, FFF (Fair-play, Friendly and Fun).

CATERING:

Free water, tea and coffee was provided at all time from the morning to the end of the each day.

Other refreshments (such as soft drink, beer and wine) and bacon rolls could be bought at the licensed bar of the Masonic Halls at cost of a couple of GBP.

Lunch was included within the tournament fees.

Hot meal was served at lunchtime on both days. Participants served food at the self-buffet:

Chili con carne, rice, vegetable and profiteroles on Saturday;

Bourguignon beef stew, mashed potato, vegetable, and the white chocolate cheesecake on Sunday.
